



# DESTINATION HEALTHY SKIN

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What is Destination Healthy Skin?

Destination Healthy Skin is The Skin Cancer Foundation's mobile skin cancer screening and education program. Our 38-foot RV is equipped with two private exam rooms where volunteer dermatologists perform free screenings. In our waiting area, program managers answer questions and distribute skin cancer early detection and prevention information.

Each year from May to September, we travel to cities around the country, screening about 1,500 people and educating thousands more. Check our schedule to see where we will be this year.

### How much does it cost?

Destination Healthy Skin is a public service program. No health insurance is necessary, and screenings are free of charge. Furthermore, you will receive free skin cancer educational materials and sun protection products.

### Do I have to make an appointment in advance?

We do not take appointments; skin cancer screenings are performed on a first-come, first-served basis and subject to dermatologist availability. We recommend arriving early if possible.

### What should I expect during my skin exam?

Skin cancer screenings take place in our Destination Healthy Skin RV, which is equipped with two private exam rooms. You'll be given a brief form to fill out while you wait for your turn. Then you'll be shown into an exam room and provided with a gown. When you're ready, the dermatologist will come into the room and examine your skin from head-to-toe. The doctor will note the findings on your form and make recommendations for next steps. The exam itself takes approximately ten minutes.

### The dermatologist recommended I get a biopsy. Now what should I do?

If a biopsy is recommended, you can ask the dermatologist if they are accepting new patients and can take your insurance.

### When are you coming to my city?

We wish we could come to every city that will have us each year! We do the best we can with the resources we have. Locations are carefully selected based on driving times, weather patterns and volunteer interest. If we are not stopping in your location this year, we may be coming next year.

### Why can't the RV be on the road year-round?

Driving, fueling, maintaining and staffing our RV with program managers gets quite expensive. Even with the support of individuals and corporate partners, we would need to raise four times the funds to keep Destination Healthy Skin on the road all year. You can help by [making a donation](#).

### Is the RV wheelchair accessible?

Unfortunately, the Destination Healthy Skin RV is not equipped with a wheelchair ramp or lift to access the exam rooms for a skin cancer screening. If you'd like to speak to a dermatologist about your skin, you can do so outside the RV, and get free sun protection samples and skin cancer educational materials while you are there.

According to the AAD's screening guidelines, dermatology residents and PAs may perform screenings only under the onsite supervision of a fully licensed dermatologist.
